Mies van der Rohe Pavilion

Less is More

The Germany pavilion at the Barcelona International Exhibition (1929) was designed by Ludwig Mies van der Rohe and Lilly Reich and hosted the Spanish King Alfonso XIII official reception to the German authorities. In this iconic work of the Modern Movement, van der Rohe (father of Modern Architecture) defined his philosophy that will inspire generations of architects. Admire the convergence of glass, steel and 4 different kinds of stone (Roman travertine, green Alpine marble, ancient green marble from Greece and golden onvx from the Atlas Mountains).

Candlelight Barcelona

Candelight offers a series of classical music concerts paying tribute to a variety of musical genres and artists such as Queen, Coldplay or Hans Zimmer in the most unique scenarios as the Recinte Modernista de Sant Pau and among thousands of candles: An immersive musical experience.

Las Golondrinas

Barcelona from the sea

The Port of Barcelona offers a new special route on the occasion of the America's Cup race in Barcelona. And it does it in a special way, because it recovers the historic boats of Las Golondrinas ("The Swallows") ships, that began their services during the Universal Exhibition of Barcelona (1888). Two daily departures (one in the morning and one in the afternoon) are organized to tour the bases of the 6 teams that will participate in the 37th America's Cup.

Bosc urbà

Bring out your adventurous side

Don't miss this "urban forest" to do sport and test your adrenaline in a park set in the center of Barcelona. Throw yourself on a zip line, cross from one side to the other with lianas, do bungee jumping, or walk along trunks located at 9m high.
